ITINERARY

Day 1 – Johannesburg – Dinner

Arrive in Johannesburg, meet & greet. Transfer from the airport to hotel.

Dinner will be at the hotel.

Day 2 – Kruger National Park –Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Breakfast will be at the hotel. Transfer from hotel to OR Tambo International Airport in time for your flight to Kruger Mpumalanga International Airport. Road transfer from Airport to Lodge. Arrive at the in time for Lunch.

Perched on the banks of one of the Kruger National Park's greatest rivers - the Crocodile River - and surrounded by tens of thousands of hectares of raw African wilderness. Set in the Southern Kruger region, east of Malelane, the magnificent 3500-hectare Mjejane Game Reserve has been absorbed into the Kruger National Park and enjoys direct access to the Kruger.



With over 14 km of Crocodile River frontage, Mjejane enjoys abundant wildlife and offers an outstanding Big 5 safari opportunity. The accommodation is comprised of standard and luxury rooms, each of which offers a spacious air-conditioned haven of well-appointed comfort with a private veranda. As the African bush weaves its magic spell, your senses will awaken as never before. **Dinner will be at the lodge.**

Day 3 – Kruger National Park –Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

All meals & activities will be at the lodge. AM / PM Game drives are offered to guests.

Lunch & Dinner will be at the lodge.

Day 4 – Cape Town –Breakfast

Breakfast will be at Lodge. Road transfer from lodge to MQP Airport in time for a flight to Cape Time. (Commercial flight is included in the rate) Arrival at Cape Town International Airport. Upon arrival at Cape Town International Airport, meet & greet & transfer to your hotel. stylish living, quality service and a tranquil setting have ensured that our guests return year after year.

Lunch & Dinner will be on own.

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Day 5 – Cape Town – Breakfast,

Breakfast will be at the hotel. Morning Cape Town City Tour + Table Mountain

Our drive to the city centre takes us past famous landmarks such as the Castle of Good Hope built in 1666 by the Dutch East India Company and City Hall, a baroque building and the Grand Parade. As we follow the city’s main thoroughfare, Adderley Street, we will see St. George’s Cathedral, the Anglican Diocese of Nobel Peace Laureate Archbishop Desmond Tutu. We will pass the Company Gardens and the Malay Quarter [also known as the Bo-Kaap] which means "Above Cape" because of its location up against the slopes of Table Mountain. In the early 18th century, thousands of slaves from Java, Ceylon and other Far Eastern regions were brought to Cape Town.

After slavery was abolished, their descendants, known as the Cape Malay’s, settled here. Continue to join a sparkling tour, witness the art of diamond cutting and the careful craftsmanship of jewellery manufacturing by skilled experts. Discover the history of the Diamond and Gold Trade in South Africa. You will be offered the option of continuing to Table Mountain, where you can ascend to the top [weather permitting] by the revolving cable car. Here, you’ll see wildflowers and the famous silver tree, and marvel at a birds-eye view of the city and its beaches. On a clear day it is even possible to see Robben Island where Nelson Mandela was imprisoned on one side and Cape Point on the other

Table Mountain is one of New 7 Wonders of Nature. Unquestionably one of the world’s most famous landmarks, it provides the city of Cape Town with a dramatic setting of unrivalled beauty. It has been fittingly described as the Old Grey Father of Cape Town. The crowning glory of Table Mountain is the strangely neat cap of cloud which, in the summer months, unrolls across the flat summit and drapes itself over the edges in a tidy, almost straight line. The famous tablecloth. The rounded 335-metre hill overlooking Table Bay. On the summit is the famous Lion’s Battery, used to fire salutes for visiting ships and on ceremonial occasions. One signal gun is fired electrically at noon every day except Sundays and the boom reverberating around the city scatters multitudes of pigeons from their resting places. **Lunch & Dinner will be at own account.**

Day 6 – Cape Town – Breakfast, Lunch,

Breakfast will be at the hotel. Full Day Cape Point / Peninsula Tour.

Your journey to Cape Point takes you along the scenic Atlantic seaboard coastal road. You pass the pristine beaches of Clifton and Camps Bay with their soft white sand and azure blue water. The formidable 12 Apostles Peaks rise above the road on one side, while sheer cliffs and incredible rock formations drop into the icy Atlantic Ocean on the other side. There is no doubt the coast of the Cape Peninsula offers magnificent scenery with its great biodiversity.

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We arrive at the quaint fishing village of Hout Bay with its imposing Sentinel where you go on boat trip to Seal Island. You can continue with your tour over Chapman's Peak which offers amazing photo opportunities, and onto the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve and Cape Point. This area is home to magnificent 'fynbos', many species of buck and birds, the Cape Mountain Zebra, and mischievous baboons. Enjoy splendid views of False Bay. Take the funicular to the lighthouse for an even better vantage point of the two Oceans.

You can have lunch at Cape Point or in Simon's Town on own . (Restaurants recommended are Black Marlin, and Two Ocean's Restaurant, Seaforth Restaurant, Harbour House Kalk Bay)



You visit Boulders Beach to see the African penguins before arriving at the naval base of Simon's Town. With the sun setting over the tall peaks of Table Mountain the last rays sparkle on the trees and flowers and offer a fitting end to a day filled with all the highlights the Cape has to offer. **Lunch included in the tour. Dinner will be at own account.**

Day 7 – Garden Route Oudtshoorn - Breakfast, Dinner

Breakfast will be at the hotel. Depart Cape Town and head north over the spectacular Du Toit's Kloof Mountain pass en route to Worcester. From Worcester we continue along the R62 (Route 62 is the longest wine route in the world) through Montagu. You can stop for a wine tasting and delicious lunch (**at own account**). Karusa is a family operated and managed wine and fruit farm. The word "Karusa" is a Khoi San word meaning Land with little water, a scarce resource in the semi-arid plateau of the Klein Karoo. Karusa is situated at the foothill of the majestic Swartberg in the tranquil and scenic Cango Valley settlement of Schoemanshoek. The farm is en route to the world famous Cango Caves. It is situated 12km north of Oudtshoorn which the capital of the Klein Karoo region is also, and ostrich capital of the world. Karusa is the first and only Premium Private winery in Oudtshoorn.

Cango Caves – Entrance fees included.

29km outside Oudtshoorn, you will come across the picturesque Cango Valley, where a spectacular series of tunnels and chambers welcome visitors to guided tours. Known as the Cango Caves, these chambers and tunnels exhibit



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breathtakingly complicated stalagmites and enormous stalactites, all lit up with different mood lighting and explained by professional guides.

Hlangana Lodge – An Oudtshoorn Hotel Location, 1km from the Oudtshoorn town centre. Walking distance from well-known restaurants: Jemima's, Bello Cibo, La Dolce Vita, Black Swan



Lunch will be at own account. Dinner will be at lodge.

Day 8 – Knysna – Breakfast, Dinner

Breakfast will be at the hotel. Today you can drive to the Ostrich Farm in the morning before heading to Knysna. Here for the first time one can understand why this area is known as the Garden Route. As you drive over the summit of the pass, lush green vegetation awaits you. You will take a drive to the spectacular Knysna Heads where the ocean surges through the two sea cliffs to enter the magnificent lagoon. Get your camera ready! Visitors hoping to catch a glimpse of the world's largest bird will not be disappointed, as ostriches are a common sight in the area. Take an ostrich tour and get up close to these magnificent creatures. Guests will have the opportunity to learn about ostriches and ostrich farming in the region. You'll even get a chance to feed them.

Depart from Oudtshoorn & drive through to Knysna. The drive is approximately 1hr 30mins.

Day 9 – Knysna – Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Breakfast will be at the hotel. **10h00 - Featherbed Nature Reserve Experience Including Lunch**

After the 2017 fire, and Featherbed is looking glorious! Our indigenous fynbos and coastal forests are flourishing like



they haven't done for ages, and the birds, the insects, and the small animals are back at work with a will. In truth, we didn't need to do much to ensure this success - nature has wonderful mechanisms for restoring itself after fire. Plants from other areas - trees, shrubs, grasses - will become invasive in a new environment if they don't meet enemies there (bugs, fungi, and so on) that slow their rate of reproduction. This leaves the locally indigenous vegetation unable to compete for space, air, and water - which is exactly what happened at Featherbed, beginning in the 1960s: an Australian wattle (*Acacia cyclops*, which South Africans call rooikrans) established itself here, and although we've always had a programme of cutting them down by hand, it seemed at times that we were fighting a losing battle. But the fires reduced about 95% of the rooikrans on the reserve to ashes - which gave us an invaluable opportunity to restart with a clean slate. The Featherbed Nature Reserve, situated on the Western Head in Knysna, is the premier eco-experience on the Garden Route.

- Return ferry trip on the Knysna Lagoon to the Western Head.
- 4x4 vehicle & trailer drive up the headland onto the Reserve, stopping at spectacular viewpoints.
- Specialist guide giving information on history, fauna & flora.
- Optional guided 2.2km walk through coastal forest and fynbos into ancient sea caves.

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- World renowned buffet lunch at an outdoor restaurant setting under a canopy of Milkwood trees.
- Wonderful family outing, suitable for all ages and fitness levels.

Late after at 17h00 guests can opt to go for a John Benn Sunset Cruise.



The John Benn is a double-decker floating restaurant offering daily Lagoon cruises to the Knysna Heads. A memorable family activity on Knysna Lagoon. One of the best floating restaurants in Knysna.
